CLASP Tutor Appreciation Dinner



Orchid environmental adaptations are inspiring and ingenious. Originally from the swamps and savanna grasslands, orchid seeds traveled through the air and nestled into the nicks and crannies of trees of hardier, nearby rainforest forests. These adaptations have come in the form of one-to-one mentoring with stronger and deeper connections for tutors and students. Tutors are quick to tell me that they have enjoyed working with the same student all year because they were able to see their growth. Some of our shy students have learned to express themselves and be open with their tutors. It has been wonderful to see them flourish at our sites.

In addition, CLASP offered enhanced and varied enrichment activities. In the fall, students created their own personal Zine, painted pumpkins to take home for Halloween and made dog toys to be donated to a local shelter for an MLK Day Service Project. Our families and CLASP community came togethe ANTONiollir to enjoy the Holidays with music provided by Treble from Citrus College. Valentine's Day Fun allowed our kids the opportunity to make tasty treats, show love to our feathered friends by making bird feeders and hone their math graphing skills with conversation hearts. Through the generosity of our community partners, we ended the year with field trips to the Alf Museum and not one, but two theatre performances at Claremont High School. We promoted thirteen 6th graders out of our program and are looking forward to enrolling new students and tutors in the fall. We continue to adapt to the changing landscape and with the deep roots and strong support of the CLASP tutors, families, and board, we have made like an orchid and will flourish as change is inevitable.
